Entries to the Organiser.

Closing date 16th May 2017 but late entries may be accepted at the organiser's discretion. All entries must be made on an official Entry Form (one per horse/pony) and must include a large SAE. Entry forms are available on the website

www.endurancegbneyorkshire.co.uk).

If the rider is under 18 please also complete a Parental consent form.

Distances:Class 1: 30km(18mls); Class 2:24kms(14mls);

Class 3: 18kms(11mls); Class 4: 15kms(9mls); Class 5: 13km(8mls) Class 6: 10kms (6mls).

Start Times: 9.30a.m. to 11.00a.m.

Change of class: Please note that in accordance with EGB rules riders may not change to a higher distance on the day of the ride. However, they may downgrade to a lower distance before the start of the ride. In this case, it is the rider's responsibility to notify the Ride Organiser and/or Ride Secretary before they start the ride. Route: mainly forest tracks, bridleways, moorland, very little roadwork – stunning scenery. One water crossing for Classes 1,2,3 & 4.

Crewing at Cow House Bank car park and CP2. Water at CP1 & CP3. Facilities: Communications, First Aid, Toilet & Refreshments.

Entry fee: EGB and Associate Members: £15

Non members: £23.00 to include day membership to comply with

insurance regulations.

Please note: £1 discount for young rides (14-21) and £3 discount for

juniors (8-13)

Misc. Maximum speed 16km/hr average. Please try to maintain a minimum average speed of 8Km/hr. All horses successfully completing will be awarded a rosette and their group mileage. Dogs must be kept on leads and under control at all times, venue is a working farm.

This ride is run under Endurance GB rules.

Save for the death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the organizers or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the Organisers of any event to which these rules apply, nor the Endurance GB, nor any agent, employee or representative of these bodies accepts any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, land or any other person or property whatsoever whether caused by their negligence, breach of contract or any other way whatsoever.

RESERVATION OF RIGHT: the organiser has the right to cancel the ride or any class, alter the advertised times, refuse any entry. The Organiser/Organising committee of this event has taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the Organiser/Organising Committee and all Officials and Stewards.

AGE LIMITS:

Horse or Pony to be 4 years or over. Riders must be 8 years or over.
Rider's aged 8–13 must be accompanied by an adult (over 18 years) at

<u>DEPOSIT</u> - of £5.00 (refunded) or EGB membership card must be given to the secretary to obtain number bib to be worn for the ride.

SAFETY:

A hard hat with the correct standard must be worn, correctly fastened, whilst mounted. No Wellington boots. Riding footwear must leave min1/2" heel unless caged stirrups used. Whips over 75cm and spurs not permitted.

Hats bearing only the EN1384 or BSEN1384 standard will no longer be accepted.

However, hats would be acceptable if they carry EN1384 or BSEN1384 and another standard such as those listed: • PAS 015 (1998 or 2011), • VG1 01.040 (2014-12), • ASTM F1163 (2004a or 04a onwards), • NELL E2001, • AS/NZS 3838 (2006 onwards).

IMPORTANT: PLEASE ENSURE YOU HAVE THE CORRECT HAT STANDARDS SOME HATS ARE NOW OBSOLETE.

Remember to see the timekeeper when you start and when you finish the ride.

ROUTE MARKING:

Will be with a mixture of orange day-glo tape, spray paint arrows and moor land flags.

GENERAL POINTS:

Horses that kick must display a red ribbon in the tail.
Novice Horses are advised to wear a green ribbon in the tail.
If you horse is a novice and kicks put both ribbons in.
Stallions should wear two blue stallion discs on their bridle and a blue tail ribbon, plus a blue ribbon on the breastplate. Your
stallion is then easily identified by other riders.
No spurs allowed
No wellington boots.
Shoes should have a ½ inch heel or that your stirrups have cages.
WHIPS no longer than 75cm
Riders please ask permission to overtake others in plenty of time, give
a wide berth and do not canter past.
Remember Stallions do compete in this sport.

Always display your number bib clearly for marshals to see.
Be polite to the general public – they may be the Farmer whose land
you are on.
Always walk when passing pedestrians.
Take care to leave all gates as you find them (open or closed)
Headcams are not permitted.
Use your map to anticipate turns as this reduces your chances of
getting lost.
Leave all vehicles locked and valuables out of sight at all times.
Lead rein entrants should be led by an adult on foot

HEALTH & SAFETY:

Please be very aware of your surroundings be it at either the venue or out on the ride.

Because of the high profile of Health & Safety/Risk Assessments within Industry and all Sports etc, we must be seen to be acting responsibly. A list will be displayed at all events.
