Huge congratulations as two of them are completely new to Endurance this year and the fact that Nancy represented her branch in the Eventing and Show Jumping championships on her 14.2 pony is just proof that you don't always require an Arab to do Endurance. The best points of the day were achieved by Evie Brampton of The New Forest, gaining her victory in the Novice class, followed very closely by Caoimhe Chambers from the Tiveyside.
